THINKERS50 CHINA LAUNCHED IN QINGDAO

Groundbreaking new partnership to explore leadership and management innovation in China and beyond.

QINGDAO, CHINA. Thinkers50, the global platform for management thinking, today announces a groundbreaking new partnership with the world's leading white goods manufacturer, Haier. The new Thinkers50 IdeasLab China will be based at Haier's headquarters in Qingdao, China.

The development of Haier is an eye-catching corporate story by any standards. It was in 1984 that Zhang Ruimin took over as Director of the Qingdao Refrigerator Factory. The small collectively-owned factory was losing money. Others had tried to turn the venture around and failed. Money had to be borrowed to pay wages and products often had to be repaired before leaving the factory.

Since then, Zhang Ruimin and Haier have cut an impressive swathe through business orthodoxy. Their experiments and innovations in management are unique in their scale. Today, Haier has 73,000 employees and annual revenues of over \$30.3 billion.

"Despite all the trumpeting of change programs and the like, large organizations tend not to change the way they operate to any significant extent. Change is often decorative tweaking rather than a radical overhaul," observes Thinkers50's Des Dearlove. "That Haier has managed to maintain business growth and ground breaking organizational innovation over a sustained period is unusual and owes a great deal to the leadership of the company. It has succeeded in well-established markets against strong competition. The fact that it is a Chinese company adds piquancy to an already powerful story."

Haier's chairman and CEO Zhang Ruimin received the Thinkers50 *Ideas into Practice* Award in 2015, when he also debuted on the Thinkers50 ranking at #38.

It is planned that the Thinkers50 IdeasLab China will play host to events and publish research. "The Thinkers50 is a global ranking and, as such, needs to understand and reflect the best thinking and best practice coming from some of the highly innovative Chinese global organizations such as Haier," says Stuart Crainer, Thinkers50 co-founder. "We hope that our base at Haier will allow us to learn more about its own extraordinary innovations in management but also the Chinese approach to management and leadership in the twenty-first century."

The announcement of this new Chinese venture follows on from the launch earlier this year of Thinkers50 Europe based in Odense, Denmark. It is hoped that a global network of Thinkers50 hubs will be able to share the latest ideas on management, leadership and much more.
